We provide rentals only to participants on our guided adventures. If you want to bring your own recreation equipment, please discuss the appropriateness with your guide. Any equipment you bring will be inspected at the start of the ESCAPE.

YEAR-ROUND

Bivy Kit

These emergency tools are required on full day hikes only. For multi-day hikes you will be expected to bring items on the pack list, which include some of the Bivy Kit items.

\$0 bring your own Bivy Kit (items are on pack list, inspected upon arrival)

\$10 to rent a Bivy Kit for a day hike;

\$120 to buy a Bivy Kit (2-day trips or longer you should have your own)

Small Pack with Liner

Book bag size (for kids and bicycle trips):

\$5 for first day; \$2 for each additional day

Medium Day Pack with Liner

For day trips (hiking, skiing, snowshoeing, S.U.V. tours)

\$15 for first day; \$7 for each additional day

Large Backpack with Liner

For multi-day hikes with room for sleeping bag, pad, food, etc.

\$25 for first night; \$10 for each additional night

Sleeping Bag and Pad

For overnights, appropriately rated for the season.

\$40 for first night; \$17 for each additional night

Tent

2, 4, or 6 Person: \$30 for first night; \$10 for each additional night

Toddler Carrier

An adult backpack that carries children age 1 to 35 pounds, with pouches for some gear, food, and water.

\$15 for first day; \$7 for each additional day

Trekking Poles

Their use is personal preference--great for snowshoeing and for bad knees, not useful on rocky terrain and they erode soil paths.

\$15 for first day; \$5 for each additional day

WINTER

Snowshoes

Available when there is enough snow on hiking/walking trails, November through May. \$15 for first day; \$7 for each additional day

Ice grippers of some sort

Used when trails are slippery but not enough snow for snowshoes.

Complimentary as needed.

X-C Skis, Poles, Boots

For groomed or ungroomed trails.

\$20 for first day; \$15 for each additional day

SPRING ~ SUMMER ~ FALL

Note: On paddle trips, one party may use a variety of types of boats, although each boat goes a different speed.

Canoe, PFD, paddles

For day or multi-day trips on lakes, rivers, and tidal water.

\$45 Tandem for first day; \$30 for each additional day

\$30 Solo for first day; \$20 for each additional day (1 available)

SPRING ~ SUMMER ~ FALL (continued)

Sit-on-Top Kayak, PFD, paddle (and thigh straps for whitewater)

These easy kayaks are versatile for all kinds of paddling. Safe and fun for beginners on ponds, lakes, and rapid rivers.

Longer kayaks and canoes are most efficient for long distance trips on lakes and in tidal water at the seacoast, whether for a day or a week, and they hold more gear than the shorter kayaks that are great for day trips.

\$35 Solo Multi-Purpose for first day; \$25 for each additional day [Flatwater to Class II Whitewater--4 available]

\$40 Solo (+ Child) for first day; \$30 for each additional day [Flatwater and Quickwater--1 available]

\$60 Tandem (+ Child/Dog) or Long Solo Kayak for first day; \$40 for each additional day [Flatwater, Quickwater, and Multi-day Touring--1 available]

Sit-Inside Kayak, PFD, paddle, spray skirt

Traditional recreational cockpit-type kayaks for day trips on lakes and quickwater rivers.

\$45 solo cockpit for first day; \$25 for each additional day

\$55 tandem cockpit for first day; \$30 for each additional day

Sea Kayak or Lake Touring Kayak, PFD, paddle, spray skirt

Efficient long-distance cockpit-type kayaks for day or overnight trips on lakes, seashore, tidal water.

\$65 solo for first day; \$50 for each additional day

\$85 tandem for first day; \$70 for each additional day

Dry Bag with liner

For storing food and gear, such as clothing and camera, when paddling...or line your own packs/duffels lined with contractor-size bags

\$5 Small for first day; \$2 for each additional day

\$10 Medium for first day; \$5 for each additional day

\$15 Large for first day; \$7 for each additional day

Bicycle/Helmet (Mountain, Hybrid, Road)

Mountain Bikes: Fat tires and many gears for easy pedaling on paved or gravel mountain roads, designated paths, and single track trails.

Hybrid Bikes: Good for paved or gravel hilly roads.

Road Bikes: For pavement only.

\$45 for first day; \$35 for each additional day (children \$35/\$25)

Fly Fishing Equipment

Complimentary on guided fly fishing trips for one or two participants

Orange Vests

During hunting season in some wilderness areas, we use hunter orange vests for safety, mainly in October and November.

Complimentary as needed

MISCELLANEOUS

Cook Kit (for some packages)

\$20 for first day; \$15 for each additional day

Archery Kit

Add \$40 to an adventure if you want target archery lessons to be included.

Wetsuit & Shoes

When paddling in relatively cold waters.

\$15 per day
